I hope everyone had a safe Holiday Season and that each of you have a very Happy New Year. I would like to thank everyone that supported our department this year with your donations. We cannot do what we do without the support of our community.


With the recent storms, fire season was officially declared over the 9th of December. With that, we had four seasonal Cal Fire employees return to volunteer status. This brings our roster to 17 full responders and 4 recruits. Since I last wrote we have staffed the station at least once a week with volunteers for 12 hour shifts and that should increase this month.

Our call volume was down significantly for 2014. We should finish around 95 calls for the year compared with 155 for 2013 and 149 for 2012.

Year to date our run totals are: 6 Structure Fires, 45 Medical Aids, 12 Vegetation Fires, 1 Vehicle Fire, 9 Traffic Collisions, 5 Public Assist, 8 Smoke Checks, 1 Station 52 Hardcover, 1 City of Redding Station Cover & 2 Strike Team Assignments.
