Board of Directors Meeting

April 19, 2017

Adoption of Resolution 2017-03, Annual Update of the Capital Improvement Plan as Included in the 2015 Water Master Plan: Pursuant to Government Code 66002(b) the Board of Directors unanimously adopted Resolution 2017-03 updating the District's Capital Improvement Plan as outlined in the 2015 Water Master Plan. The Capital Improvement Plan outlines the infrastructure necessary to meet the increasing demands upon the distribution system which results from new meters being installed.

Adoption of Ordinance 2017-01, Amending Ordinance 96-1, Section 2, Plant Capacity Fees: In accordance with the District's Water Master Plan's Capital Improvement Plan Schedule, the Board of Directors unanimously adopted Ordinance 2017-01 amending Ordinance 96-1, Section 2 Capacity Fees. Effective July 1st, the adopted Capacity Fees for new meters are listed below:

<u>Meter Size</u>	<u>Capacity Fee</u>
3/4"	\$ 15,125.00
1"	\$ 25,205.00
1 1/2"	\$ 50,420.00

It is imperative to keep them unobstructed at all times for ease of access during emergencies. Weed eating, clearing brush and/or obstructions, is all part of the District's Hydrant Maintenance Program.

Please **adopt a hydrant** near you and inform us of any maintenance issue that might arise or if there has been tampering of any kind. A non-working fire hydrant can make a big difference in an emergency situation. Working together we can ensure that every hydrant is working at its optimum performance.
